## Synopsis of Research Report

### Putting Research Evidence to Work (PREW): Key Issues for Research Utilisation in Irish Children's Services

The first stage of PREW was to produce this report on the barriers, facilitators and approaches to putting research evidence to work based on a review of literature, a consultation process to establish access to and application of research by managers and practitioners, and a review of international web-based research dissemination mechanisms.
