Synopsis of Reports

Inter-agency Co-operation in Children's Services in Ireland: The Views of Some Stakeholders

As part of our 2008 Network Seminars the CAAB undertook a consultation process with professionals working in children's services. This report focuses on stakeholders' experiences of inter-agency co-operation and on their views on future requirements to enable better inter-agency co-operation. A total of 12 focus groups were held, with more than 100 participants.

An Analysis of Research Literature on Inter-agency Co-operation in Children's Services

This project involved an analysis of research literature on inter-agency co-operation focusing on three main areas: international literature, previous Irish public sector literature and literature on inter-agency co-operation in children's services in Ireland.

Organisational Case Studies of Inter-agency Co-operation in the Delivery of Children's Services

This study focused on six case studies (three Irish: Londubh Project, The Ballymun Network for Assisting Children and Young People and Southill Youth Forum and three international: Minnesota Child Protection Services, Miami-Dade Juvenile Assessment Centre and Every Child Matters UK) of inter-agency co-operation in the delivery of children's services. The overall objective of this study was to produce a number of organisational case studies illustrating examples of inter-agency co-operation in the delivery of services to vulnerable children and to identify key findings across all six case studies in terms of motivations, approaches, benefits and lessons.

Guidance to Support Effective Inter-agency Working Across Irish Children's Services

The purpose of this document is to provide a succinct but comprehensive, evidence based, guidance to support effective inter-agency working across Irish children's services.
